#### National Reconciliation Week 2021

This past week (27 May - 3 June) has been National Reconciliation Week. These dates



commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey - the successful 1967 Referendum and the High Court Mabo decision respectively. Reconciliation Australia's theme

for 2021 is More than a word. Reconciliation takes action, urges the reconciliation movement towards braver and more impactful action. All Australians play a role in Reconciliation - individuals, families, communities and organisations. At our assembly last week, students

presented learning activities as part of this journey.



You will also notice on the Southern End of the Admin building a print of the artwork 'Journey of Success'. The original artwork was



created by Ngarrindjeri artist and designer Jordan Lovegrove, specifically for the Department for Education in South Australia to represent the Aboriginal Education Strategy 2019 to 2029. The artwork symbolises both the intent of the Aboriginal Education Strategy and

Reconciliation for the department. When you are next in the school, please take a moment to check it out.

#### Progress monitoring of student learning

As educators, it is important to know how students are progressing in their learning. Progress monitoring informs teachers practice, identifying changes that need to be made to better accommodate the needs of students. At Kapunda Primary School, we have clear processes in place for progress monitoring. Using the data collected determines the level of support needed for the student. This is referred to as the 'Wave' approach which can be broken into three layers —

Wave 1 - Whole Class

- TEACHING: Explicit Teaching of identified skill for a period of time
- REVISION: Review and revision of skills
- PROGRESS MONITORING: Teacher to reassess students on just the deficit skill area using original assessment sheet

Wave 2 - Small Group

- Students with yellow data (similar scores to be grouped together)
- Sessions to be 15 minutes maximum
- Minimum 2 sessions per week for a term or 15 sessions before reassessment for progress monitoring
- SSO/Teacher to document student progress/knowledge

Wave 3 - 1:1

- 1 child only
- Students with red data
- Sessions to be 5 minutes maximum
- explicit skill practice, fast and quick, repetition, review
- Minimum 2 sessions per week for a term or 15 sessions before reassessment for progress monitoring
- SSO/Teacher to document student progress/ knowledge

You may notice in the morning when dropping your child off in their classroom teachers carrying out progress monitoring with students. Parents/Carers are always welcome in the classroom, but we ask that you understand that teachers may not be able to have an in depth conversation with you in the morning as they may be progress monitoring and we ask that if there are matters/concerns that need more time that you make a meeting time with the teacher.

# COVID-19

As many of you would be aware, circumstances with COVID-19 in Victoria continue to change on a daily basis. It is important that we continue to keep our students and staff safe over the next term and ensure adults can social distance whilst on site.

Following directions from the Department for Education and SA Health, the latest requirements must remain in place:



27 May - 3rd June

Throughout the past two weeks we have been celebrating the culture and history of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people for Reconciliation Week. Classes have read stories, created art work and explored symbols as a form of language and communication to gain greater knowledge of the history of the traditional owners of the land that we live on.

We held a whole school assembly last Friday to explore the meaning of reconciliation and the significance of the dates that it is held on each year. The school captains helped to create a time line that gave us some perspective of the history that Aboriginal people have with Australia, placing some dates that we find significant against the 60,000 years that Aboriginals have inhabited the land.

The theme for Reconciliation Week this year is:

More than a word. Reconciliation Week takes action

We also spoke of other ways that we can take action to support reconciliation in Australia (taken from 20 ways to take action on the Reconciliation Week website):

Acknowledging country – our school has a great interactive Acknowledgement of Country. It is important to know and acknowledge the traditional owners of the land that we are on.

Call out racism – Mrs Worroll has spoken before at wellbeing assemblies about calling out casual racism. It is important to catch ourselves when we are making comments or judgements made on someone's appearance or culture. It is also really important to call out your friends and family if you see them doing the same.

It's all our history – We highlighted in the assembly just how much we still have to learn about the history of Australia and its traditional owners. By creating a visual timeline we showed just how much we still have to learn.

Care for country – the Aboriginal people have looked after the land for over 60,000 years. They are experts at looking after the environment and we can learn so much from them and help continue it in the future.

Make reconciliation everyone's business - We ended the assembly by promising to share what we have learnt at school with our friends and family to promote understanding, unity and reconciliation.
