COVID-19 Principal update - 27th July 2021

Dear Parents/Carers,

Today the Premier announced that schools, preschools and children's centres will reopen to all students tomorrow (Wednesday 28 July). As a result, our school will be open.

We will not be offering an alternative home-based learning program unless your child is impacted by SA Health quarantine orders.

As the Chief Public Health Officer said, just because the hard lockdown is being lifted does not mean that the risks associated with COVID-19 have passed.

Consequently, we have taken some immediate actions and steps and will monitor and review as we receive more information from SA Health and the Department for Education.

As a result, the following requirements are in place:

- drop and collect your child <u>at the gate</u> and maintain the appropriate physical distance from other adults
 If you are collecting your child/ren early, please contact the Front Office staff on 8566 2008 to arrange
 collection.
- · all school events, excursions (which includes swimming) for the next week have been postponed
- require all staff to wear masks when indoors, on public transport or on school buses.
 Please note that staff will not have to wear masks while teaching or working directly with students.

Students can wear their own cloth masks. We also have supplies of surgical masks available if they need them.

Your child might have questions about wearing masks. It's important we continue to follow SA Health advice and your continued cooperation is greatly appreciated as we help students and staff with this necessary change.

KEY ACTIONS FOR PARENTS/CARERS

The following requirements are in place:

- Keep your child/ren home, even if they are only displaying mild symptoms; get tested. Remain at home until all clear has been provided.
 You will be contacted to collect your child/ren if they present with cold/flu symptoms.
- All conversation with teachers are to be conducted over the phone, email or via class online forums e.g. SeeSaw, Class Dojo.
- 3. All volunteer programs cancelled
- 4. There will be no lunch orders through 'Litl Mo's on Friday
- Ensure your contact details are up to date (best contact number, emergency contacts).
