Improving outcomes

Our teachers have done an excellent job of working with our students to improve learning outcomes. NAPLAN results are about to be released to parents and I can already say our results are very pleasing. Many of our students are in the higher bands for their age group and nearly all of our students achieved National Minimum Standard. In the next newsletter I will provide a summary of the results. We are also busy with PAT M/R tests and the results from tests already completed are excellent. Our recent Phonics Screening Check (PSC) to see how Year 1s are progressing in their phonics shows 65% of Year 1 students achieved the expected achievement, up from 42.9% last year. These results are a reflection of the whole school agreements in place and the great work of our staff.

Parent Support

With our year once again being ravaged by Covid, none of this could have been possible without the help of our parents, who have been such good partners in our children's education journey. I love the job of being Principal of Kapunda Primary School. Our students are amazing; our community is great and our staff support the learning potential of our children. I can truly say they go above and beyond. Certainly one of the best parts of my role is being able to

celebrate the amazing things our staff and students do and the achievements they amass over their time with us.

Year 6 and 7 2022

As you would all be aware, 2022 marks the start of a new era, when both our Year 6 and 7 cohort of students move to High School. This means we will lose a large number of students at the end of this school year. Planning for 2022 is well underway and it is vital to know if you will be leaving the school (not Year 6 and 7) or know of any new families coming to Kapunda. Based on our projected incoming students, and with the large exit of Year 6 and 7 students, at this stage it looks like we will be having 10 classes in 2022 (down from 12 classes in 2021).
