### 2022-2024 Site Improvement Plan

Like all South Australian public schools, Kapunda Primary School seeks growth for every student, in every class. To achieve this we regularly establish school Improvement goals as we seek to improve our practices and provide a better education for all students, to build them a stronger future. Establishing and maintaining our school's performance occurs through ongoing reflective practice and self-review to create opportunities for innovation and is measured through NAPLAN testing in Years 3, 5 & 7, and annual Year 1 Phonics Screening Check and Progressive Achievement Testing for all Year levels.

Our overall 2021 school results in NAPLAN are excellent. For the past three years we have kept a strong focus on improving students' reading and numeracy. In doing this we have made changes to 'what we teach' and 'how we teach' in line with what current educational research considers to be best practice. On Monday leadership deeply analysed our data to support the development of our next three year Site Improvement Plan that will set ongoing improvement goals, establish what the challenges are to our practice and determine what our actions will be to meet specific success targets.

### Volunteers back on site


