
Kindy students leave they are able to return to their classroom. The current Reception children will have the opportunity to play with the Kindy students during recess.



When something funny happens I cant control it. I laugh out loud. –Aidan-


My stomach was aching. I was about to explode into a million pieces. I pushed the plate to the middle of the table. I'm so full. -Marlon-
