# **COVID-19 update**


Unlike other schools in the region, we have been very fortunate that COVID has not had a significant impact on our day to day operations. This is despite several cases. It is important though that we do not become complacent. We can't stress enough the importance to monitor symptoms and even if your children are slightly sick, keep them home and if necessary, have them tested. What we are trying to do is ensure everyone is safe and keep the wheels turning. There is a significant shortage of relief teachers at present, and SSO Curriculum staff are not able to be backfilled. We need to all work together to ensure that we keep everyone in our school community healthy.

The Department for Education cleaning services have been increased at all department children's centres, preschools, schools and offices by an extra cleaning shift during the day. This includes more regular and thorough cleaning of door handles, light switches, and wiping down common areas such as meeting room tables,

administration areas (reception desks) and tables in libraries.





#### Student Wellbeing News – Term 1 Week 5

Through the first part of the year, through the inspiration and guidance or Mrs Worroll, all staff have been studying the book *Clarity* by Lyn Sharrat. Throughout the book there are many great ideas that we are already actioning as a site. One idea that I would like to share with the KPS community is the notion of parents as the most important teacher for a child and the shared responsibility we all have in a child's education.

With the current restrictions and conversations similar to the one below we understand that this may be a concept that you are struggling with right now.



If you're looking for ways to create more meaningful conversation to play a greater part in their learning try some of these.

### Keep it positive

At the end of a long day we can all find it hard to focus on the positives. Try any of the following positive questions to help your child see the positives in their day.

- 1. What was the best thing that happened today?
- 2. What made you laugh today?
- 3. Who made you smile today?

- 4. What is your favourite thing about your classroom?
- 5. What are you looking forward to this year at school?

Students might not answer all of these questions but by just asking you are planting positive thoughts in their mind that will grow.

## Visual prompts

All classes try and post on Seesaw or class Dojo as often as they can. Use these pictures along with any from the newsletter or school Facebook to try and encourage conversation.

Ask questions about the new school captains or the piece of art that was posted. This will let your child know that you are still very much a big part of the school.

#### Go deeper with questioning

In the book *Clarity* Lyn Sharrat has 5 questions that she recommends that parents should ask for informative conversations with their children.

- 1. What did you learn today?
- 2. How did you do?
- 3. What did you do if you didn't understand?
- 4. How can you improve on your learning?
- 5. What are you most proud of?

These questions go beyond the what and comparing to other students to help you understand how you child learns. Again children may not have an answer for these questions every day but they begin to be the stepping stones to having greater insight into your child's classroom, the great work their teachers are doing and allow you to be involved by offering advice to your child.

If your child does give you some great answers please share them with their class teacher.

The teachers are working really hard at the moment to catch up on the weeks lost at the beginning of the year so any positive feedback for their hard work would be great!




