Professional learning communities (PLC)

Over the past two years, we have shown great resilience and adaptability as our day to day lives have changed due to the impact of COVID. Despite the challenges of COVID, the school has endeavoured to keep learning at the forefront.

Our teaching staff are currently deeply engaged in their professional learning communities around the text 'Clarity'. PLCs are an action in our 2022-2024 Site Improvement Plan.

WHAT ARE PROFESSIONAL LEARNING COMMUNITIES?

A professional learning community (PLC) in schools involves collaboration, sharing and ongoing critical interrogation of teaching practices in line with professional standards. PLCs are learning-oriented and promote the growth of teachers and students.

WHY PROFESSIONAL LEARNING COMMUNITIES?

- PLCs are more effective than individual champions in ensuring that school-wide pedagogical changes are sustainable
- PLCs help develop teachers' confidence and self-efficacy
- Students achieve at higher levels in schools with positive PLCs

- PLCs encourage and build effective leadership and management
- When teachers across a school implement the same learnings and strategies, they create a consistent learning experience for students

Our PLCs are in year level teams (JP, MP and UP), with each member of the leadership team belonging to one also.

At the start of the year, students learnt about each other through these Self-Identity collages.





In Science, the year 5/6 students have been investigating how plants and animals are adapted to grow and survive in their environments. We use lots of Maths games to help build our mathematical fluency and understandings. "Salute" is one of our favourites. Why not try it at home?!

Salute You need: three people, a pack of cards

- 1. Choose the first leader.
- 2. The leader says "Salute". The other 2 players pick up a card

and hold it to their own forehead (without looking at it). The leader can choose to say "the total is" (and mentally add the cards together), or "the product is" (and mentally multiply the cards together).

- The first player to correctly say their card wins. They keep both cards (to keep score).
- 4. After an agreed amount of time, rotate roles, so that all players have a turn as leader.


