

From the Principal

National Reconciliation Week - 27 May to 3 June 2022

Last week we recognised and acknowledged National Reconciliation Week. The dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey - the successful 1967 referendum and the High Court Mabo decision respectively.

27 May 1967 On this day, Australia's most successful referendum saw more than 90 per cent of Australians vote to give the Australian Government power to make laws for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and recognise them in the Census.

3 June 1992 On this day, the Australian High Court delivered the Mabo decision, the culmination of Eddi Koiki Mabo's challenge to the legal fiction of 'terra nullius' (land belonging to no one) and leading to the legal recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the Traditional Owners and Custodians of lands. This decision paved the way for Native Title.

"Be Brave. Make Change." was the 2022 National Reconciliation Week theme. Many classes undertook their own activities to assist students to reflect on the meaning of the week "Be Brave. Make Change." and to acknowledge the way that all Australians need to work to

continue to reconcile and come together in friendship. Last week was not only about being brave and making change, but being brave and making change every day.

Resilient learners

Teachers at Kapunda Primary School work closely with students to develop a learning environment that supports and encourages critical and creative thinking while enabling them to apply new learnings into different activities.

Educational struggle is an acceptable component of learning that builds students ability to apply a Growth Mindset to new learning. Students at Kapunda Primary School tackle new challenges with the understanding that learning takes a lot of effort. They don't give up when things get difficult, because they have strategies to persevere. They take risks, participate in class and understand that mistakes are normal when people try challenging things. It's important for our students to build their resilience and learn what to do when things don't go to plan. Working in our supportive and collaborative environment enables our students to view learning as an opportunity to grow and transfer and apply different strategies to solve a problem or group task.

It's a great reward watching our students grow and develop their learning skills together.

They have been busy gathering ideas from their classes on how to improve the school and have formed small groups to research and action these ideas.

Some examples of the things that the group are following up:

Rupert Farley has been inspired by the recent fundraising for Motor Neurone Disease through the Big Freeze, so through the help of some younger students was exploring the costs behind hiring a big dunk tank or giant slide. The group did some great research and unfortunately came to the conclusion that it wouldn't be a viable fundraiser for the school, due to the cost of hiring these things. Although this was disappointing for the group it showed some great real world learning. They have also came up with a more achievable fundraising idea, so keep your eye out for details and teachers get your raincoats ready!

Riley Pritchard, one of our school captains, with the help of Isaac Chappell are in the process of organising a basketball competition in the gym for Middle and Upper Primary students. The boys want to start this competition to encourage all students to get involved in some organised games and mix with students from other classes. The two boys will mix the teams themselves to ensure they are fair and will roster the games. This is dues to start next week.

The Upper Primary Student Voice reps have all been brainstorming ways to utilise the space on the oval better.
