

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Thank you so much for supporting our school, especially through fundraising. This term, we are hosting a **Colour Explosion School Fun Run** to help us fundraise for more play equipment on our sweat track. To help achieve our goal, we need to raise \$9,000 as a school community.

When is the Colour Explosion School Fun Run? We will be hosting our Colour Explosion School Fun Run on the last day of Term 3, the 30<sup>th</sup> September. More info about the day will be in next week's newsletter. The colour powder will likely wash out of your child's clothing. Nevertheless, we recommend that your child wears a white shirt that you don't mind being coloured, if they don't have one, there will be some available from the front office.

Is the powder safe? The non-toxic colour powder is made of high-quality corn starch and permitted food colours, so it's safe for skin and eyes. The staff will do their best to aim the powder towards the torso. However, wind may cause the powder to protrude onto your child's face or hair. Sunglasses will be provided for students on the day. Students with asthma are advised to be careful and they will be supported by staff on the day. Ingredient listings and toxicology risk assessments are available at the Front Office.


